
# Highlights of the April 11 Board Meeting

# MAZDA MIATA M COUPE CONCEPT CAR MAKES WORLD DEBUT AT NEW YORK INTERNATIONAL AUTO SHOW



NEW YORK, April 3 /PRNewswire/ — Since its introduction more than seven years ago, consumers and automotive enthusiasts have wondered if Mazda would ever be able to top its stunningly successful Miata roadster. With the world debut of the Miata M Coupe concept car, Mazda has done just that — added a top to one of the best-selling sports cars of all time creating a stunning coupe. The Miata M Coupe will be on display at the Mazda exhibit at the New York International Auto Show, which runs from April 6-14 at the Jacob Javits Center.

The Miata M Coupe concept car was designed and built by Mazda's research and development facility in Irvine, Calif., to explore the potential of the Miata platform. There is ample historical precedent for the transformation from open roadster to closed coupe. In fact, many of the automotive world's most beloved sports cars have followed a similar development path, from the Jaguar XK 120 and E-type to the MGB and Triumph Spitfire.

The most noticeable aspect of the yellow mica M Coupe is, of course, its flowing roofline. The addition of the roof necessitated a reshaping of the rear decklid. The new decklid, along with the relocation of the spare tire to beneath the trunk, gives the M Coupe substantially more trunk space than the Miata roadster.

The door cutline of the Miata M Coupe sweeps upward in a graceful arc, echoing the lines found on Mazda's dramatic RX-7 sports car and on the Miata M Speedster concept car shown at last year's New York Auto Show.

Other features of M Coupe include a set of pop-up low-profile quad headlights, cross-drilled brake rotors, 16-inch alloy wheels with Dunlop SP8000 performance tires and a free-flow exhaust system.

Inside the Miata M Coupe, the seats have been covered with a suede-like fabric, highlighted by an embroidered "M" logo on each seatback. In addition, a leather and aluminum shift knob tops the gearshift lever and attractive charcoal carpeting covers the floor and rear cargo area.

Since its introduction, Mazda has sold more than 350,000 Miatas world-wide, making it today's best-selling two-seat roadster. In the United States, one out of every four sports cars sold is a Miata. The Miata has also spawned the largest single-model car club in the world, the 30,000-member strong Miata Club of America.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1 their work in your hands right now! I'm certain you are pleased!


