Download Instructions SDMC Membership List

Currently approximately 94% of our members have access to the Internet. This capability allows you, as a club member, access to Yahoo groups. What's so special about Yahoo Groups? This gives us access to all the SDMC email, photo catalogs, and list information. On this site we offer club members a membership list that includes, name (both member and SO), phone number (this field is blank if you request it), car year, car color, license plate, and home city (NOT address or zip). This information is available to members ONLY! To access this information you MUST acquire (FREE!) a Yahoo Group account. Once you have this account setup do this:

- 1. Go to http://groups.yahoo.com/ (on left, top of screen you will see sign in section, logon here with name and password) note; most browsers will allow you to save this location with your password and login name. Bookmark this location and everything will be automatic after this point in time.
- 2. In the upper left corner you will see a section that says "My Groups." Put your cursor on SDMC-LIST and single click the left mouse button.
- 3. You are now on our group site. You can get to email, photos and other sources. In this case, look in the upper left section and place your cursor over "Database" and single click.

 4. You are now in the Database section
- 4. You are now in the Database section and you will see a list of available club databases. Single click on the desired database (most current as of this instruction is "July 2003 SDMC Membership Roster")
- Membership Roster.")
 5. You are now in the database and you will see a list of all club members. To sort (alphabetize by last name), single click on the field labeled "Last Name." You can sort on any other field you desire.
- 6. To print; single click on "Printable Report." On your browser go to "File" (upper left corner) and single click. This will drop a pull down menu of file functions. Near the bottom of the drop down menu you will see "Print." Single click this command.
- 7. A print menu will pop up giving you access to your printer controls (this presupposes that you have a printer hooked up to your computer). Once your printer is configured to your

Once your printer is configured to your liking, single click on the "OK" or "Print" button.

8. Voila! you now have 17 (or so) pages of the SDMC Membership Roster.




"SURF SPEAK: ONE KEY TO SAFARI FUN" BY LES SMITH

efore departing for Surf 'N Safari, memorize the following 20 words and statements; make sure you understand their meaning and become comfortable using each one. Mastering these will be essential for communicating with other participants and having a good time.

After all, if you can't talk the talk, how do you expect to walk the walk, run the run, shop the shop, party the party, eat the eats, drink the drinks, dance the dance, and zoom the zoom?

- Together: What you and other Miata aficionados from 22 other clubs, Canada and even The Netherlands will be for four days.
- Dude: Male homo sapien attending Surf 'N Safari; female of the species is referred to as a Dudette.
- Where it's at, man: Pala Mesa Resort, just off I-15 at Route 76, then north two miles on Old Highway 395.
- Trip: The drive to Pala Mesa Resort; usually uninteresting to Miata drivers and passengers and lacking of twisties. Tolerable, though, because the trip only whets the appetite for Friday's nine count 'em, nine -- runs.
- Out of sight, or outasight: Where the Miata behind you during runs should not be when looking in the rearview mirror. (If this happens, wait at the next turn until that Miata is in sight.)
- Get it on: What must be done immediately with parts and accessories bought at the Vendor Mall.
- Put down: What people do very quickly when picking up a spark removed from an engine before it cools off.
- Upper: A road such as the South Grade of Palomar Mountain heading north on which the front of the Miata is higher than the rear. This phenomena will be demonstrated during at least two runs on Friday.
- **Downer:** The other side of the South Grade Palomar Mountain highway.
- Cool: (a) Any San Diego Miata Club member who volunteers his or her time for Surf 'N Safari. (b) Typical October weather in San Diego County, so bring a jacket.
- **Strung out**: Common condition when Miata runs travel on heavily traveled highways or in populous areas. Commonly avoided by planning run routes that, for instance, take 74 miles to travel a 34-mile distance.
- **Bummer:** Word that will be uttered regularly by folks who don't stay at Pala Mesa Resort upon hearing about all the really great times they missed out on during the off-hours. Also, when the back group of vehicles in a run gets cut off by a traffic signal, such as where Highland Valley Road crosses Route 67.
- Dealer: Business enterprise partnering with San Diego Miata Club to assure the success of Surf 'N Safari; i.e., Cush Mazda is underwriting the cost of a really cool tote bag being given to each registrant.
- Get down: What most of us have to do when entering our Miatas.
- Turn his (sometimes her) head around: What you would like to do to some OTM drivers who (a) don't seem to realize that they're in the middle of 30-plus identical cars traveling together and (b) don't have the sense to pull over and allow them to regroup.
- **Spaced:** When a safe distance is maintained between Miatas on runs so they don't bump into each other.
- Wrecked: Likely description of most guest rooms at Pala Mesa Resort during Surf 'N Safari before housekeeping arrives. Totally acceptable because occupants are somewhere else having a great time.
- Wasted: (Note: There is no appropriate application of this term in regard to Surf 'N Safari.)
- **Right on:** Technique by which Miata owners preserve battery power by turning off headlights when engine is not running; opposite of "left on."
- **Pusher:** One way to get a Miata after a driver has turned off the engine and left on the headlights. (Caution: DO NOT attempt this with an automatic transmission.)
- Groovy: Road condition in areas that experience considerable moisture; improves traction.

BACK TO BASICS—BY SCOTT LEWIS, TECH EDITOR

guess it is time for me to get back to work on a tech article after my last article in July. I have been a bit sidetracked the last three or four months with homework from night school and classes three nights a week 45 miles from home. <Whew>. Glad that is over... For now <sigh>.

What shall we talk about this time? Brakes! Why brakes? Because if they are broke, you cannot brake! I crack myself up sometimes. So let's cover some of the BASICS here. We will not be getting too in depth with this

due to many personal choices.

I know none of you would be driving with bad brakes anyway. Right? How would you know if they were bad? I'm not talking about not being able to stop your Miata. I am talking about changing the pads, brake fluid, bleeder screws, hoses, calipers, and rotors. I am sure most of you know all of these components can wear and may one day need to be replaced. So, with that said, lets look at the pads first. In my experience with front pads, I have used the "auto part store" best, EBC pads, Hawk pads, and factory Mazda pads. EBC and Hawk may be considered for hard braking and autocross purposes and work very well. In my case, I use factory pads in the front with the exception of using Hawk pads on occasion for performance reasons. For the rear pads, I have learned that factory Mazda parts seem to be the best I have used for autocross and street driving. Again, we are not going too indepth here with the pad issues.

How often do you change your Miata's brake fluid? It depends on how you drive your Miata. An autocross driver may change the fluid as often as every few race events due to the heat exchange on the track. My '90 gets new fluid roughly every six or seven events at most. Just look how clear the new fluid is in comparison to the fluid in your Miata's brake reservoir. Anything other than a see thru "straw" colored fluid is a candidate for changing. Usually, most old fluid will be a dark grey color. I find that using a turkey baster to draw out the old fluid is very help-

ful.

Bleeder screws are replaceable too while you are changing the fluid or just bleeding the brakes. Quite possibly the best invention since the Miata, is the "speed bleeders". I have replaced my bleeders with this wonderful invention available at most auto part stores. I found mine at NAPA. You may want to bring in one of your front and rear screws to match then up. Basically, it allows you to bleed your brakes without someone having to keep pumping your pedal for you while you say, "open, close, open, close, open, close..." Just remember to fill up the reservoir while doing this.

Rotors do not wear out as often as pads, but do require inspection. Many rotors get resurfaced during a brake job while some choose to just install new pads without doing this. Best to check with your mechanic or by using a micrometer. You may have that pulsating feel when you are braking. This could be caused by warped overheated rotors. Right?? You may also choose to install new rotors all together. Factory parts work very well as

do many aftermarket.

The brake caliper is often overlooked during a brake job by the home mechanic while trying to get those darn pesky spring/metal thingies back into place with the pads. Just a simple glance at the overall condition of the caliper can suffice. Be sure to look at the inside area of the caliper for any fluid present where it contacts the pads. Any wetness can be a sign of a bad piston.

Of course, the brake hoses play a vital role in making the system work properly. Leaks, worn, or cracked hoses need to be replaced. You may choose to go with stainless steel brake lines or stock rubber lines depending on your driving habits. Stainless steel lines do not tend to swell under hard braking and high heat as will a rubber line.

Like I said, this is just a basic rundown of some ideas that may help answer a

question or two. Please refer to your repair manual or local mechanic for any questions you may have about the Miata's brakes. I have my own opinion as will most everyone out there who works on their own Miata. I know, I know...If you wanted my opinion, you would give it to me.:^)
