- 3. Phil Daoust SDMC





Back in June, when we first envisioned this adventure, we decided we would go even if nobody else wanted to. But, to our delight, a total of 19 others decided to join us! And, as Steve has already said, enjoying the adventure with other like-minded friends makes it all the more fun!

Our trip started at Deer Spring Rd & I-15. Our first stop was the Summit Inn & Cafe for lunch. Then we continued into Victorville to visit their Route 66 Museum. Next we took Route 66 to Barstow and visited their Route 66 Museum too. After overnighting in Barstow, we began our Route 66 adventure to Williams, AZ. Virtually all of our trip from Barstow to Williams was on Route 66 with only brief sections of I-40 required. We visited many famous Route 66 towns and landmarks. It was a wonderful driving adventure!

A few facts and figures:

- Total distance traveled by Miata was 1,026 miles!
- About 400 miles of that was on Route 66!
- Total distance traveled on the Grand Canyon Railway was 130 miles!
- Highest temperature reading during the drive was 106º!

- Lowest temperature reading during the drive was 59°!
- It rained heavily but relatively briefly during our time on the longest continuous stretch of Route 66!
- The thunder and lightening show was AWESOME!
- During that rainstorm, the temperature dropped from 100° to 59° in a matter of minutes!
- It rained prior to our arrival in Williams but didn't rain a drop in Williams while we were there!
- While at the Grand Canyon, it was raining heavily on the north rim with the rain slowly moving toward us on the south rim!
- The rain and clouds on the north rim made for some great photo opportunities!
- As we boarded the train for the return trip to Williams, it started to sprinkle lightly!
- Only after everyone had already boarded did it start to rain heavily... perfect timing!
- Our group meal/celebration at the Red Raven Restaurant was fantastic!
- I took nearly 400 photos!
- Cathy and I are ready to do it all over again!

On Sunday, August 21, I had the pleasure of leading a group of SDMC music aficionados on a run. We drove to the Summergrass San Diego Bluegrass Music Festival at the Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum in Vista.



We met at the McDonald's on Via de la Valle, just east of the Del Mar Fairgrounds (note for people who have not yet led a run: leading a run is a good way to make sure that you don't have to drive a long way to your run's starting point. Since I live in Carmel Valley, this was very close to my home).



The fun began at the Drivers' meeting, where Elliot Shev surprised those in attendance by handing out all sorts of Miata-branded goodies, including ZOOM-ZOOM sunshades for our cars.





Directions were handed out and then we left.





The drive to Vista was uneventful, although I did learn on the way that when on a freeway, it is easier for everyone to follow if we at least drive one lane over from the right. That way we miss all of the merging traffic.







When we arrived at the Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum, we were directed to a special parking area inside the 50 acre park, instead of in the large parking lot where everyone else was parked. Steve put up our SDMC banner, so passers-by could see who we were.



Then someone from the park took us to the gift shop, where we purchased our discounted admission tickets to the festival. Parking for us was free.









Even if there was not an event going on, the sprawling park is a great destination in itself, with plenty to see and do. It contains things from California's farming days of the early 1900s. This includes tractors, enormous steam engines, a farmhouse, large, weaving on fully operational old knitting machines (with their hand-made products for sale), delicious home cooking, antique cars and trucks, a kids' play area with a working small scale train and much more. There are lots of open areas.



As for the Bluegrass Festival, many professional musicians entertained us all day. We set up our folding chairs under a huge parachute, which provided much-appreciated shade from the hot sun.







My favorite musical groups were made up of the kids that performed at lunch time. Apparently they had participated in workshops for the multi-day festival, and this was their chance to perform in front of a big audience.



The next big event at the Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum will be on the weekends of Oct. 17th and 18th, and then on Oct. 26th and 27th. That is when they will be having their annual Fall Tractor Show. There will be live entertainment, working antique equipment demonstrations, weaving demonstrations, wagon rides, blacksmithing, vendor booths, an antique equipment parade each day and much more. They even have on-site camping available.







We have been invited to return to the park as a club, hopefully to put on a big car show. They promised to give us preferred parking within the park again. 

Driving and Putting: Mini-Golf Tournament Follows October 24 Run


