- Sunday afternoon run will tour the back roads in the area.
- Dinner on both Saturday and Sunday will not be a group event, although many will choose to eat together as there are many wonderful choices for dining in the area.

How to participate:

Go to the Madonna Inn website (www.madonnainn.com) and proceed to the "Room Features Grid" under the Accommodations tab. Browse through the rooms and select a few. Some may already be reserved. Call the Madonna Inn and reserve your room. You may chose to stay in a different room each day. Mention Miata Club as the group so you will get a discounted price on the second night. There is also a 10% Seniors discount for over 60. There are multi-bed and multi-room accommodations available for those of you that like to share the experience more intimately.

Notify me when you have reserved at the Madonna Inn, including what room(s) and who your companion(s) will be.

Sit back and wait. More will come the closer we get to "the Launch."

If you are unfamiliar with the Madonna Inn and would like a little information or help in deciding on a room, Laurie and I would be happy to help with experience and opinions.

Warning: You will notice that the Madonna Inn is NOT cheap. However, it is a first class resort with a completely unique experience.

Sunday, April 7

The Puke is an event where drivers (Pukers) are divided into separate run groups of no more than 15 cars. Each group drives the course which is designed to connect many of the "twistiest" roads in San Diego County into a fun-filled experience that has been known to cause an occasional passenger to have "stomach discomfort" ... hence the name.

Start location:

Cool Hand Luke's – 110 Knoll Road, San Marcos, CA 92069

Directions: Eastbound on Highway 78 exit at San Marcos Boulevard. Go north on San Marcos Boulevard to the first traffic signal and turn left onto Knoll Road. Turn left at the first traffic signal entering the shopping center parking lot. Proceed ahead until you see the restaurant on the left. When westbound on Highway 78 exit at San Marcos Boulevard and proceed straight through the traffic signal onto Knoll Road. Then turn left at the first traffic signal entering the shopping center parking. Proceed ahead until you see the restaurant on the left.

Times:

9:00 am – Cool Hand Luke's will open for a Buffet Breakfast for us.

10:00 am – Drivers meeting – We will break drivers into groups of 10 to 15 cars each assigned to experienced Puke run leaders and sweep drivers. Then groups will be released to begin the course with each group alternating directions of the approximately 130-mile distorted figure eight course.

10:15 to 10:30 am – Groups will begin exiting the parking lot to begin the Puke.

11:00 am – All groups will be on the course and driving.

Pit Stops:

There will be two pit stops during the running of the Puke. Each will be at Dudley's Bakery in Santa Ysabel.

The Finish:

Beginning at approximately 3:00 pm, groups will begin returning to Cool Hand Luke's. The restaurant is prepared for our return, and we will be welcomed back for an early dinner or late lunch. Order from the menu and enjoy the embellishments that come from all "Pukers."

The start of the New Year was punctuated with the Annual Rose Run for 2013. This year's Run Leader, Rosi Romero earned her magnetics by treating the participants to a driving journey around the South Bay and an opportunity to witness some spectacular, truly Southern California views and attention-grabbing landmarks. Soon after the 27 Miata Club cars departed the Rancho San Diego Village Mall, they found themselves parked atop and alongside Apple Street (a/k/a Dictionary Hill). They were gathered together



overlooking the beauty of the blue and lightly cloud peppered sky reflected by the Sweetwater Reservoir Lake below... And, with cider champagne glasses filled and raised high, 44 club members toasted to 2013 and to "Many More San Diego Miata Club Runs!"

That celebration spirit kicked off an energetic run thru one familiar Campo Road that led to not often traveled Otay Lakes Road. Throughout the spirited curvy drive, Landmark sites were passed: The supposed secret whereabouts of local myth ogre "Proctor Valley Monster"; the popular local Thousand Trails Pio Pico

Resort; and, a premier Sky Diving location of San Diego County. The sunshine was bouncing brightly on the lakes as the maneuvers continued along the Upper and Lower Otay Lakes. Statistics crackled through our CB's, enlightening our intellect with interesting factoids of these landmark areas. (Who knew the alleged record set for Bigmouth bass caught here was 25.1 lbs?) An hour in and the welcomed arrival to Otay Lakes County Park was realized (really, was that an hour ago we ate at the



IHOP?). Those who diligently followed the run leader were treated to what will surely be one of the most memorable segments of the run; driving in a 360 circle at the lookout point. With mischievous smiles a few remembered to look out their right side window at the southernmost point of the lookout to witness the beauty of the lower west side of the Otay River Valley and the majestic Landmark Otay River Valley Bridge in the distance... the rest just wished that roundabout was driven at least 2 or 3 more times!

A special unexpected treat during the Park stop was an encounter with an SCCA racing member who took the time to bring over his lotus racing car project. Equipped with a Miata engine and a lot of hand made parts, it was a treat to share in this young man's prized hobby.

The beautiful Otay Lakes Park offered many photo opportunities and was a great resting spot for this run. Soon after, and armed with our rolled-up-quarters, the club cars travel back on Wuste Road to Olympic Park Way, giving a thumbs up along the way to the South Bay's Internationally known 155-acre Olympic Training Center, the one that supports more than 80 Olympic Athletes in more than 15 sports, and the one that is proud to have provided in the last Olympics with athletes that competed in 29 events that brought home 4 medals, including a Silver. Bravo!

The hurried drive-by Otay Ranch Mall caused a few complaining-moans from some of the shopaholics in the group, but it was quickly forgotten with the speedy entrance into the State Route Hwy 125 South entrance ... and "Woah! Hold on to your hats, folks!" was heard! Once every car was up to speed, the smooth driving through the Southbay Express Way and anticipated driving over the connecting Otay River Bridge was also recognized as highlights of the run. Seeing it up close this time with its stunning curvatures and its near 200ft high arches served well to demonstrate its importance in connecting the busy Otay Mesa international border crossing to the existing San Diego freeway network. What a thrill to drive it.

Soon the group was aligning, and for most that did not benefit from owning a transponder for Fast Track pay, the effort was made. Taking 1x1 turns paying the toll and afterwards, many with eager foot on the break AND the accelerators, endured a short freeway lineup - something akin to a long motorsports pit stop. Alas, before long, all the Miata's were traveling throughout the Otay Mesa Area. Steering far away from the overpopulated Donavan State Prison, the officially mandated holiday-off day provided an excellent non-traffic jammed opportunity to tour what is typically the busiest commercial border crossing in California and the third largest among US/Mexico border crossings. The typical 1200+ trucks that travel all over this area were amiss which granted a great opportunity to point out their routes (and keep the club run in tight form with no OTM's!). From the vehicles, nearby United States Customs facilities were seen and past year's mind-blowing news of the discovered tunnel area was pointed out.

Traveling the freshly opened 905 Otay Mesa Freeway was a quick way to arrive to the frequently traveled Dairy Mart Road via Beyer Blvd. (Did anyone ever call that car dealer on the corner of Dairy Mart Road and Beyer and ask what the asking price on the '04 Red Miata was?). The drive through Monument Road provided quick views of Border Field State Park (don't blink or you might miss it!) and neighboring country's road to Playas de Tijuana. The dead-end-stop was the furthermost southwest point in the United States of America that our vehicles could drive to, legally. And yes, the group was within a stone's throw of our neighboring country, Mexico!

The cruise down Coronado Avenue/Imperial Beach Boulevard was full of famous Imperial Beach sites: Famous Street ART, Imperial Beach Pier, "Touch-for-good-luck" I.B. Surfer Statue, Surfboard Street Museum,

Camp Surf, Tijuana Estuary... all filled our eyes and senses to the brim. Slow cruising required, the traditional Beach Style way!

Rainbow Drive led us to the Silver Strand Scenic Drive which provided another famous and often-seen-on-post-cards-spectacular view of the San Diego Bay. Of course the Ooooh's and Aaah's were heard as the famous Coronado Hotel and it's "baby brother" The Coronado Boat House were approached. Ocean Boulevard rewarded the drivers with the soulful sound of Ocean waves crashing in the distance. And driving by the North Island Naval Air Station reminded everyone, Coronado is a Naval Force town. The run would have been incomplete without the drive over another special Landmark: the San-Diego-Coronado Bridge. (or as the locals call it, the Coronado Bridge). Although safe focused driving is a must while traveling over its 2 mile length and 200 foot height, who doesn't always sneak a quick glance to catch the marvelous view of San Diego Bay, Downtown and the South Bay?

The tummies were grumbling, sensing eateries were soon to be reached, but the lead driver had to show off just one more special treat of the South Bay... the Bayside Parkway. High five's were encouraged and seen as a quick drive-about the park was experienced. Care was taken NOT to run over any Quail running about...

No Miata run is ever complete without some good eats, and this one was non-the-less for it. The ending spot at The Galley at the Marina provided a cozy welcome, excellent food and a beautiful ending to a great beginning.

Golf Run & Tournament III

Attention all "not-quite-ready-for-the-real-thing" golfers. Our club's annual golf tournament is moving about seven miles south this year to the Sorrento Canyon Golf Center. Date is early afternoon Saturday, March 2. There will be a run before and a picnic/awards ceremony afterward.

We'll be stepping-up the event this year by playing the center's 18-hole putting course. Not to worry; it's still a ground game played entirely with a putter (like miniature golf). Players will be grouped into foursomes (pre-arranged teams are encouraged) and there will be prizes galore! After all, it is a tournament.

No prior golf experience is necessary (as will become apparent quite early). Green fee is \$6.00 (San Diego Miata Club corporate rate) for the 18 holes. Bring your own putter if you have one.

Neatly tucked into the space between a hillside and parking lot, the par-3 course is mowed greens bordered by course-grade grass, several ponds, some rocks, and moderate elevation changes. No need for caddies and golf carts. It must be a fun place because trash containers located along the course are full of beer bottles.

Mark the date (Saturday, March 2), arrange a foursome, and it never hurts to practice your putting game in preparation. Or, stop by Sorrento Canyon Golf Center (5605 Carroll Canyon Road, just east of I-805 at the Mira Mesa Boulevard exit) and play the course in advance.
