Dyanna was born in Montgomery, WV on October 2, 1949, daughter of Hansel and Clarice Brown. She lived in several cities and small towns in West Virginia and Ohio by age 18, then two years with her father's family in California before returning to West Virginia.

Dyanna's parents both remarried and her life as an "only child" changed at age 16 as seven brothers and sisters began entering her life.

Dyanna and her son Sean Clay welcomed Les Smith into their lives in 1978. They moved to San Diego in 1987 and grandson Degan Clay was born to Sean and his wife in 1993.

Dyanna was a Dental Assistant when enrolled in the inaugural Dental Hygiene class at West Virginia Institute of Technology, graduating in 1975. She worked with Dr. Jeffrey Keeny and staff a majority of her years here.

Dyanna was active in her community, professional and social life as a member of Mira Mesa Women's Club, First United Methodist Church San Diego, San Diego County Dental Hygienists' Society, and San Diego Miata Club. ●

MARRY ME? A Miata Love Story



party and slide show with full narration by Diane, and a pot luck dinner to share more conversation and her beautiful backyard. It was a wonderful evening of non-car related camaraderie.


