## Beyond Miataland - The 'Ring

While the Twelve Little Indians of the SDMC group solved the mystery of Italy and got on the plane and returned to LAX, I stayed another 9 days with my son and family in Luxembourg. Here are trivia items: Steve and Laurie Waid's son, Scott, was a classmate with my son Kevin in high school. Also, my son was a soccer referee when Steve supervised the soccer refs in Rancho Penasquitos.

Northern Luxembourg has a lot of twisty roads. I saw more Miatas in Lux in a few days than I saw in Italy in 2 weeks. On my next trip, I will see if I can rent a Miata from a dealer there to drive on those roads.

One of the highlights of staying in Lux is that the Nurburgring is only about 80 miles away. Be sure to allow enough time to take in the museum at the track. It will easily take you 3 hours to take in most of the history. The gift shop will also take some of your money if you let them. The track is 12.9 miles in length. Jackie Stewart nicknamed the track "The Green Hell".

So, after 3 laps, I can cross "Driving the 'Ring" off my bucket list. What an experience! You really have to concentrate on the track ahead as well as keep your eyes on your mirrors. Cars were overtaking us going anywhere from 50 to 70 miles faster than we were. Blind turns and off camber turns add to the excitement. The Karussell is very bumpy, like a cement washboard that's about 80 years old.

Timed runs are not allowed on the tourist days. On the day we were there, the track was only open to the tourist drivers from 5:15PM until 7PM. Porsche had rented the track for the rest of the day.

There are some very skilled drivers that drive on the 'Ring. Some have purchased annual passes. The staging area to get started on the

track reminded me of being in the pits at a race. The only supercar I did not see that afternoon was a Ford GT. Every other make of car was on the track or about to be driven on the track. Definitely something I hope to do again when I visit my son the next time.

Driving the 'Ring is taken very seriously. No tech inspection is necessary, instructions are given to make sure you have sufficient air pressure in the tires and fluids and fuel for the run. That's all you are told.

No stopping is allowed on the course. You can drive it yourself or rent a taxi or car for the experience. BMW 3 series are available to either drive or use as a taxi, e.g. "Rent a Ring" is the name of one rental agency. To drive your own rental BMW, it's a mere 1,995 Euros for just a couple of hours. Or, amongst other types of cars, you can rent an Audi R-8 if your bank account is big enough.

If you want to drive the 'Ring in your own car laps are 25 Euros on Monday through Thursday, 30 Euros on Friday and Saturday. You receive a plastic card aptly titled The Green Hell, using that card to pay for your lap(s).



The drive to the 'Ring and around it was on my last day staying in Lux. Then it was time to return home to the states with some terrific memories of Italy, Luxembourg, Germany and the SDMC Italy tour. **T&T**


