I was fortunate to attend the L A Auto Show for the first time in many years, the day after Thanksgiving. Not in possession of the press credentials (*Sacre bleu*! Twists & Turns should be recognized as automotive press, don't you think? – Ed.) that Jan Wagner, Elliot Shev, and Laura Byrd enjoy, I was forced to brave the crowds looking for a way to walk off the previous day's accumulation of feasting calories. Walking at least four miles, I was able to assess just what's going on in the automotive firmament.

I made mental notes of several themes on display there:

- ◆ The color orange is indeed the "new black" as the Garons' 30 AE license plate claims. Many of the vehicles on display were swathed in orange livery. Orange appears to be the new power color.
- I can't recall a single major auto manufacturer display that didn't tout an all-electric vehicle, or a hybrid at the very least. Even driver-centric Mazda's display forecast its entry into that scene. With Ferrari's May unveiling of its 986 hp Ferrari SF90 Stradale plug-in hybrid, it's becoming clear the performance balance is shifting to horsepower over weight.
- Ford's bold move in naming it's new, all-electric people mover the "Mustang" drew mixed reactions, as one might expect. My first impression is that it mimics the proportions of the Tesla X cross-over; it's not un-attractive, given its purpose, but it's definitely NOT a Mustang in mission or the pony car segment. It would be analogous to Mazda's naming of the popular CX-5 SUV the new *Miata*.

I leave you with that chilling thought. I hope to see many of you at the Annual New Year's Rose Run – it's simply one of my favorite ways to begin the New Year! Maybe we'll sing a chorus or two of Auld Lang Syne. On second thought ...
